Members of the Visions Northwest group, serving as the CEDS Committee, and Northwest Regional Planning Commission board members gathered on October 9th to participate in a Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats (SWOT) exercise to determine priorities for the next five-year (2020-2024) CEDS for the region.

district; defines the vision, goals, and objectives of the district; and designates and coordinates strategies and/or activities to accomplish and implement its goals. Some of the top priorities identified through the session in the region include: workforce strategies (attraction of new and utilization of existing), the need for more workforce housing, ongoing drug issues and the need to identify partnerships across region to address this challenge, as well as broadband/cellular infrastructure.
